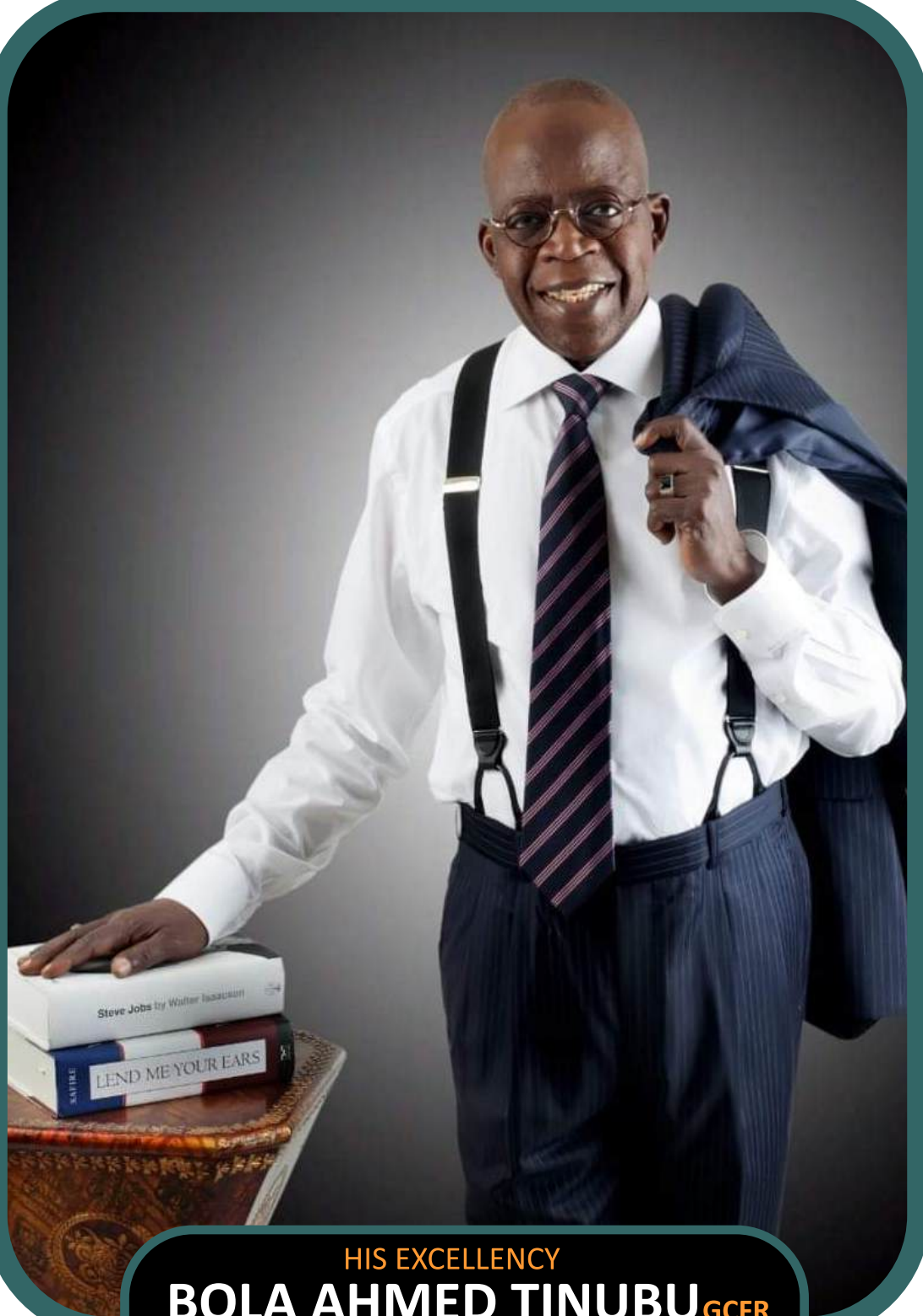

At a tender age, Hajiya Hadiza faced many daunting challenges having lost both her Mother, Father, and 13 siblings to the cold hands of death, now left with her only surviving brother. In the words of Friedrich Nietzsche, "To live is to suffer, to survive is to find some meaning in the suffering." This assertion is a true reflection of the life of Hajiya Hadiza who, did not only survive her travails, but equally found meanings in her suffering, never gives up in life.

Inspired by the challenges she faced in her early life, Ambassador Hajiya Hadiza dedicated her whole life to serving mankind and total devotion to God in honor of her late Mother, Father, and Siblings, In a bit to fulfill her altruistic impulse, Ambassador Hajiya Hadiza unilaterally founded the **Hajiya Hadiza Foundation**, which has since its inception, brought smiles and succor to many widows and children of Nigerian fallen Heroes, vulnerable women, children, and the poorest of the poor across the 36 States of the Federation.

On January 16, 2024, the Hajiya Hadiza Foundation held a remarkable event in at Borno State led by Ambassador Hajiya Hadiza M. The foundation also gave each IDPs cash gifts. The IDPs thanked the foundation for their generosity and kindness and prayed for the repose of the souls of the fallen heroes. The 60 Widows Empowerment Centre, was not left out where the foundation empowered 60 widows of ex-military generals who died in the line of duty. The widows received items such as sewing machines, hair dryers, grinding machines and other industrial items to help them become self-reliant and productive. The foundation also gave each widow cash gifts. Thereafter the widows expressed their appreciation to the foundation and said they felt honored and remembered by the gesture.





The Hajiya Hadiza Foundation recently held an event where it offered scholarships to 65 students of the University of Abuja as part of its empowerment scheme to reach out to the less privileged in the society. The offer was made to the students of the university across different faculties, the beneficiaries, which included less privileged persons who struggled with financing their education. 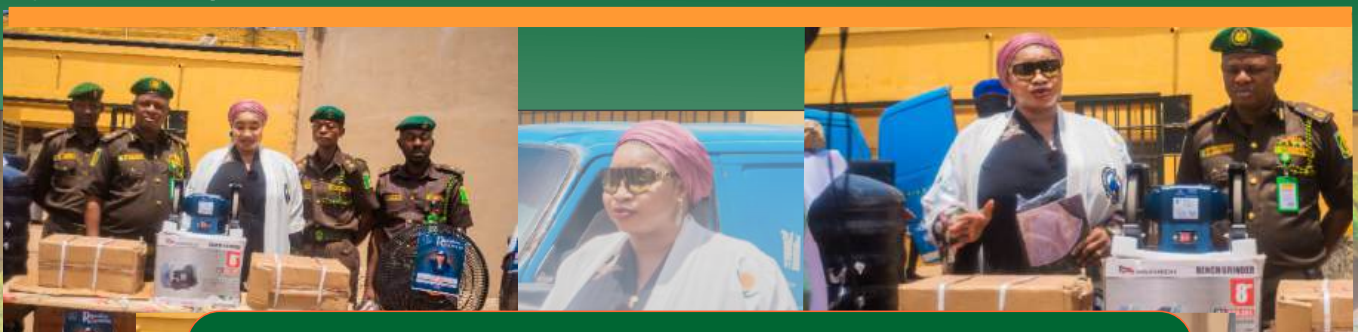

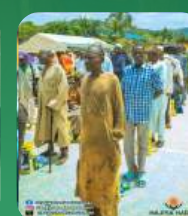


On how the government can drive the process of nation building effectively, she said that the government should supervise and monitor the process by giving responsibility to credible people who could be trusted to deliver on the job.

A Beacon of Hope:

HUMANITARIAN FLOOD RELIEF EFFORTS BY HAJIYA HADIZA FOUNDATION IN SHETTIMARI, BORNO STATE

In response to the devastating flooding in Borno State, the Hajiya Hadiza Foundation deployed a team of support staff on a relief mission to support the victims of the flood. While the floods affected several regions across the state, the foundation's relief efforts were focused around the Shettimari Area, located down the Madube water section.

The floods claimed numerous lives, caused widespread damage to homes, infrastructure, and farmlands, and left many families displaced with no access to essential resources. As an organization committed to community welfare and humanitarian service, the Hajiya Hadiza Foundation took decisive action to address the immediate needs of these vulnerable communities.

Access to clean water, food, and medical care was severely limited, and the Foundation organized the distribution of essential relief materials to ease the suffering of those impacted by the floods. The distributed materials included:
